My name is **Michal Zmora**. On June 8, 2024, my life, and the lives of my two young children, was shattered. That day, **my husband Arnon Zmora**, **a commander in the elite counter-terror unit Yamam, was killed during a courageous rescue mission to free four hostages held in Gaza**: Noa Argamani, Almog Meir Jan, Andrey Kozlov, and Shlomi Ziv. The operation was later named *Operation Arnon*, in his memory.

To the world, Arnon is remembered as a hero. To us, he was so much more - a loving partner, a devoted father, a gentle and steady presence in our lives.

In the days, weeks, and months that followed his sacrifice, I struggled to understand how to move forward, how to build a new life for my children and myself without him. Like so many families since October 7, we found a source of strength and support through the IDF Widows & Orphans Organization. Through their care, we discovered a community that holds us, accompanies us through grief, and helps us take slow, fragile steps toward healing.

To those who have supported families like mine through the IDFWO - with generosity, compassion, and quiet strength - I want to say thank you. Your support has already made a real and tangible difference in our lives. Your help ensures that widows and orphaned children receive not only practical assistance, but also stability, dignity, and human warmth along a very long road of recovery. This support is real. It changes lives. It carries families through the darkest moments and reminds us **that we are not alone**.

My name is **Revital Djaoui Ben Yaakov**. My life - and the lives of my three children - changed forever on October 7, 2023.

My husband, Lior, deputy head of our community's security team in our small moshav, rushed out that morning to defend us from a terrorist infiltration. Just steps from our home, he was killed protecting our community and our family. I was in the safe room with our children - Ella, Ziv, and Itamar - trying to keep them calm as our world was shattering.

In the days that followed, I didn't know how to face a reality without Lior, let alone rebuild a life. The **IDF Widows & Orphans Organization** became our lifeline. For the past two years they have given us emotional support, practical help, and - most importantly - a community where my children did not have to explain their pain. Through their **Otzma programs**, my children slowly found friendship, and even moments of laughter again. And I, through their healing programs, found a group of new sisters.

Since October 7, hundreds of new widows and children have entered this painful reality. Families, just like mine, are facing shock, fear, and grief - and they need this support just as desperately.





On October 7, 2023, Lior Ben Yaakov was killed while defending Moshav Mivtahim from Hamas terrorists. He was 44 years old. Lior served as the deputy chief of his community's local security team and was posthumously recognized as a fallen soldier with the rank of sergeant major in the IDF reserves.

Lior is remembered as a man of deep responsibility and quiet leadership - a devoted father, loving husband, and tireless community member. He was equally at home changing diapers and making ponytails as he was leading community initiatives and developing entrepreneurial projects for the benefit of others.
